HOW TO SAFELY DISPOSE OF WASTE

GENERAL INFORMATION

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED

PICKUP DAYS

RECYCLING

All materials must be placed curbside by 7:00 AM on the collection date. **Do not place items in plastic bags.**

COMMINGLED ITEMS:

GLASS: only food and beverage containers made of unbroken clear, brown or green glass. **METAL CONTAINERS:** food and beverage containers, clean aluminum foil and trays, and empty aerosol cans. **PLASTICS:** ONLY PET and HDPE plastic containers (code 1 and 2 printed on container) commonly used for food, beverages, detergents or shampoos.

All commingled items should be rinsed, lids removed then combined in one bin or more. **Metal lids can be placed in the bin with commingled items and plastic lids should be placed in your regular garbage.** Labels need not be removed.

PAPER ITEMS:

NEWSPAPERS, OUTDATED PHONE BOOKS, MAGAZINES, JUNK MAIL, BROCHURES, CATALOGS, ADVERTISEMENTS, LETTERS & ENVELOPES: Place at curbside in the "Blue Box", brown paper bags, or corrugated cardboard boxes. Do not bundle them with cord, twine or rope, or put them in plastic bags. **CORRUGATED CARDBOARD & BROWN PAPER BAGS:** Remove excessive amounts of adhesive tape, tie in bundles or break down and box. Do not place in plastic bags. Keep items dry.

Medical waste, syringes, IV bottles, IV tubes, etc.

Light bulbs, kitchenware, crystal, mirrors & windows, paint cans, pesticide containers, oil cans, five gallon pails, foam plastic, plastic bags and flower pots.

Any container containing potentially hazardous chemicals.

Hardcover books, orange juice containers.
No styrofoam or plastic packing materials.

HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE

Regular household garbage will be collected twice weekly on designated days. **Please note that on holidays garbage collection will be cancelled for that day which will result in only one pickup that week. See Schedule on reverse.**

Recyclables, household hazardous wastes, large items qualifying for bulky pickup

BULKY WASTE

FEE: \$20.00

Residents may arrange for bulky waste collection on scheduled days by contacting DPW at 337-7338. Please note that payment must be received before the scheduled pickup date. Items for collection must be placed at curbside the night before or by 7:00 am the morning of the scheduled pickup.

Items of Collection: Old furniture, old carpeting and padding, old books, dried open paint cans. Basically anything too heavy for regular garbage that does not qualify as a household hazardous waste.

Car batteries, car tires, building materials, debris from construction work, bath tubs, water heaters, heating boilers, iron, steel, stones propane tanks.

Refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners (properly stickered with freon and doors removed). Computer monitors and television monitors, washers, dryers, electronic equipment.

2ND THURSDAY
OR
FRIDAY OF THE MONTH

BATTERIES: Spent household batteries such as those found in flashlights, radios and toys **may be placed in your regular garbage.** Please call Public Works for all other batteries.

Car batteries (return to place of purchase(\$5.00 rebate) or bring to Household Chemical Cleanup day)

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

Hazardous household chemicals should never be thrown away with your regular garbage or poured into drain. Household hazardous chemicals should be brought to the Household Chemical Day held by the County. Qualifying items are: bleaches, varnishes, stains, swimming pool chemicals, fire starting liquids or kerosene, pesticides, car batteries, used car tires (maximum 10), waxes and polishes; photographic chemicals; wood preservatives; septic tank cleaners, TV's and computer monitors. For more information about this program contact the Household Chemical information line at (914) 813-5425. **Propane tanks must be disposed of by the individual homeowner. Latex paint (dry cans qualify for bulky waste pickup), solvents, and pesticides, compressed gas cylinders/propane tanks, explosives, smoke or fire detectors, products from commercial and institutional users.

YARD WASTE: Over the past two years we have encouraged our residents to use brown biodegradable bags for yard waste material. The use of these bags has increased the efficiency of our program as well as created a cleaner landscape.

This year we are requesting all residents to use biodegradable bags for all their yard waste except for collection of branches and fall leaf pick up.

1. Please do not put concrete, soil or other non-organic material in the bag and do not overfill them.
2. Branches should be cut into 4 foot lengths and tied into bundles not exceeding 18" in diameter.
3. Keep all yard waste behind the curb and not in the street.
4. We encourage our residents to leave their grass clippings on their lawn as a means of recycling. Grass clippings can also be placed in your yard waste in biodegradable bags.

AUTUMN LEAVES

All autumn leaves are to be placed behind the curb and kept off the streets and sidewalks. **DO NOT MIX TWIGS, BRANCHES, RUBBISH, FLOWERS OR ANY OTHER MATERIALS IN THE LEAF PILES AS IT DELAYS COLLECTION.** Place all twigs, grass clippings, etc. as stated above in a separate pile removed from the leaf pile. **DO NOT BLOCK FIRE HYDRANTS OR STORM DRAINS.**

OCTOBER 15
