Bronxville School—A Chronology

| 1870 | First Bronxville School building, “The Little Red Schoolhouse,” is built on the west side of Pondfield Road. It is a one-room schoolhouse where a single teacher taught children of different ages. |
| 1903 | Bronxville voters approve the withdrawal of Bronxville from an Eastchester school district and the incorporation of a new school district coterminous with the boundaries of the Village of Bronxville. |
| 1906 | The Bronxville Board of Education decides to replace the Little Red Schoolhouse with a “Yellow Brick Schoolhouse,” which is built on the same site. The new schoolhouse is a graded school with separate rooms for grades one through eight. Rooms had thirty-six desks each, all bolted to the floor. The school curriculum emphasized memorization, repetitive instruction, recitation and long hours of usually solitary study. |
| 1921 | The trustees of the Bronxville Board of Education, and particularly Ralph W. Guinn and his mentor as educational leader, Frank Ross Chambers, guide the board toward the adoption of the principles and methods of the new progressive education movement. These emphasized instruction based on the individual student’s interests |

and abilities; a student's freedom to develop naturally; teachers who saw themselves as guides, not taskmasters; careful attention to everything that affects a child's physical development; and scientific study of student development.

- 1922 Bronxville School, which began offering post-elementary education during the World War I years, added twelfth grade classes to its curriculum in 1922, the year in which the New York State Department of Education accredited the school's high school program. The first high school class, consisting of five students, graduated in 1923.
- 1922-1936 Under the guidance of superintendents Alexander J. Stoddard and Willard W. Beatty, Bronxville School experiences an intense period of creativity in curriculum development based on the principles and methods of progressive education.
- 1923 The Board of Education asks local architect Harry Leslie White to draw up plans for a new Bronxville School facility. Walker decides on a two-building plan, one for the elementary school and another for the high school, both completed in 1925. The area in between the two buildings set aside for a World War I memorial. The memorial was built well forward of the two buildings, however, and they were joined together by a grand central addition in 1930. The addition, most importantly, provided classrooms for a junior high school.
- 1938 Superintendent Frederick H. Bair admits that "the high school is de facto a college preparatory school." Bronxville School was, under Bair's leadership, moving away from a commitment to progressive education and toward more traditional approaches.
- 1943 The Board of Education engages the University of Pennsylvania's Educational Service Bureau to examine Bronxville School's educational and administrative functions. The bureau issued a comprehensive 130-page report which found fault with some aspects of the school's progressive curriculum. Superintendent Bair implemented several of the report's recommendations during the remaining two years of his tenure.

- 1946 *Educating Our Children in The Bronxville School: A Report by the Board of Education to the Citizens of Bronxville*, which was a response to the findings of the University of Pennsylvania's report, demonstrates that the pursuit of progressive ideals at Bronxville School will have to coexist with a growing determination to control school costs.
- 1949 Former Bronxville High School Elizabeth Penney publishes *A Study of the Graduates of The Bronxville School*, based on responses to Penney's questionnaire by almost half of the approximately 1,500 people who had graduated from the school. The respondents indicated that they appreciated the school's broad liberal arts curriculum, the emphasis on independent study and self-discipline, and the fostering of broad interests. They were critical, though, of the school's inadequate career and college guidance, insufficient training in basic study skills, inadequate attention to spelling, grammar, geography and basic mathematics skills, and general isolation from the "real world."
- Late 1940s-1960s Greater attention is given in Bronxville High School to student test scores and other aspects of a curriculum centered on preparation for college.
- 1955 The Board of Education retains an architectural firm to draft plans for a substantial addition to the elementary school building and another addition to house a new auditorium, gymnasium and lunchroom. Voters disapproved the resulting plan in 1956, probably because of concerns regarding cost and because the Board of Education did a poor job of marketing the proposal.
- 1957 Louis H. Braun is appointed superintendent of schools. Braun believed in individualized instruction and small class size, but he made clear to the Board of Education that his stance as an educator was anti-ideology and apolitical; he did not espouse progressivism or any other educational doctrine.
- 1957 Superintendent Braun appoints a twenty-five member Citizens Committee to Reconsider the Bronxville School Building Program which he hopes will restart the planning to improve Bronxville School's aging facility which were initiated in 1955 and terminated by the voters' disapproval in 1956.

- 1958 A citizens' committee formed by the Board of Education to study the elementary school program issues the so-called Henderson Report, which strongly endorsed the elementary school's emphasis on individualized instruction.
- 1959 The Citizens Committee to Reconsider the Bronxville School Building Program issues its report, which presents a remodeling and construction program proposing to renovate existing elementary school facilities and to build an elementary school addition and an addition that would house a basketball gymnasium, cafeteria and teen center. In 1960, voters approved two bond issues, one for \$1.9 million, the other for \$600,000, to fund the committee's proposals. Work on the remodeling and construction program was completed in 1962
- 1963 The New York State Department of Education ranks Bronxville School among the state's top five public schools.
- 1966 Superintendent Braun introduces a "New Curricula" which emphasizes an investigative approach to learning and problem-solving based on the use of reason rather than on memorized information.
- 1968 School enrollment reaches 1,391 students, a record that will not be approached again for thirty years.
- 1969 Voters approve a \$50,000 bond issue, the proceeds to be used to equip a science room and hire a new science teacher. In 1973, voters approved a \$60,000 bond issue for various capital improvements. Voters approved another \$170,000 in bond issues for further capital improvements in 1974. Another \$70,000 was approved in 1978; another \$50,000 in 1979; \$125,000 in 1981; \$192,000 in the 1980s; and \$262,000 in 1984.
- 1979 A Publishing Center is created within the elementary school which allows students to publish their creative writing projects as properly made books.

- 1983 Superintendent of Schools William H. Greenham and the Board of Trustees establish a Long Range Planning Committee to examine Bronxville School's program, facilities, staff, and financing needs. The committee's report, submitted in 1984, results, among other things, in a significant increase in the use of computers in instruction.
- 1986 Voters approve a \$4.5 million bond issue to fund the first major renovation of the original three school buildings.
- 1988 School enrollment declines to 889 students.
- 1989 Parents fund a major renovation of the school auditorium.
- 1991 The Bronxville School Foundation is established by community leaders and the board of education with the charge of raising money to fund projects "to enhance the quality of public education in Bronxville, according to the foundation's mission statement. The foundation is especially active in increasing the place of technology in school instruction.
- 1992 The Board of Education appoints committees to make recommendations in the areas curriculum, special education, computer technology, finances and demographics, administration and personnel, and the place of the school in the community. Many of the recommendations result in significant changes in school facilities, programs and policies.
- 1995 The Board of Trustees, influenced by findings of the recommendations of the planning committees appointed in 1992, proposed a major renovation of and addition to the elementary school. Voters subsequently approved bond issues totaling about \$1.3 million to fund the proposal. The renovated and expanded facility opened in early 1996.
- 1997 Voters approve the proposed \$18 million Bronxville School budget despite a decline in State aid and an erosion of the village tax base.
- School enrollment climbs to 1,254, up sharply from 889 students in 1988.

Collection Description

The Bronxville School Collection had its origin in a miscellany of materials relating to the school's history that was stored for many years in a closet in the high school library. The collection may have included records of the Parent Teacher Association and associated parent support committees, alumni files, perhaps a yearbook collection, printed materials, photographs, and other materials. The activities of the Bronxville School History Committee—formed in 1992 with the purpose of preparing a history of Bronxville School—resulted in a considerable enlargement of this collection of materials relating to the school. The committee's history of the school—*Portrait of a Lighthouse School* (1997), written by Claudia Keenan—was published in 1997.

The collection of documents and photographs now known as the Bronxville School Collection was transferred to the Bronxville History Center in the early 2000s and materials have subsequently been added. It includes a probably complete set of high school yearbooks; a large but incomplete collection of copies of the high school newspaper *The Mirror* (also published under other titles); a small collection of Board of Education correspondence from the years 1903-1914 and 1921-1928, the material from the latter period relating to the acquisition of land for and construction of new Bronxville School buildings; collections of minutes and other documents created by the Parent-Teacher association and the elementary school and high school parent councils; materials relating primarily to student activities accumulated by several teachers; materials relating to class reunions; and large collections of printed materials and photographs. The photograph collection includes a large and various subject file; a very large group of yearbook photographs from the ten-year period 1982-1991; and photographs from Bronxville School's public information office documenting the period from the 1990s to the 2000s.

With the possible exception of its small collection of Board of Education materials, The Bronxville School Collection does not include the records of Bronxville School, which are in the custody of the originating school offices and departments. Many school records have been destroyed by flooding and other causes over the years. The most serious loss was of many, perhaps most, of the minutes of meetings and related records of the Board of Education going back to 1903; these records were destroyed when the room where the board had met for many years and where their minutes were stored was remodeled in about 2000.

Series Descriptions

Box Nos. Series

1-36 *Printed Materials File, 1914-2022.* 19.1 linear feet (about 37,000 pages). Consisting of three subseries:

- Boxes 1-26: *Bronxville High School Yearbooks File.* High School Yearbooks, 1925-1926, 1928-2022, 11.5 linear feet (about 22,000 pages). The set is complete except, possibly, for 1922, 1923, 1924, and 1927, which may not have been created. Arranged chronologically.
- Boxes 27-32: *The Mirror File.* Boxes 23-25: *The Mirror, 1923-2008.* 3 linear feet (about 6,000 pages). *The Mirror* was the Bronxville High School student newspaper. It was published at different intervals at different times—semi-weekly, monthly, bi-monthly. It is always called *The Mirror* in this finding aid, for clarity, but it went by several names over the years: *The Mirror*, 1923-1924, 1970-1971 and 1998-2008; *The Bronxville Mirror*, 1925-1926, 1928-1947, 1951-1956, 1958-1970, 1971-1973, and 1976-1991; *The BHS Mirror*, 1973-1975; *The Medium*, 1991-1992; and *The Bronxville Medium*, 1992-1998. The title is uncertain in years not included in the list above. Arranged chronologically.
- Boxes 33-36: *Printed Materials Chronological File, 1914-2007, 2017.* 4.6 linear feet (about 9,200 pages). Programs, guides, handbooks, directories, course catalogs, calendars, reports, newsletters, literary magazines and journals, yearbooks (Middle School), and other materials. Arranged in approximate chronological order.

37-52 *Subject File, 1890, 1900, 1903-1905, 1909, 1922, 1924-2007, 2015-2020.* 6.8 linear feet (about 13,600 pages). Reports, correspondence, memorandums, budget documents, curriculum materials, research materials, planning documents, student writings, speeches, lists, invitations, dramatic scripts, manuscripts, petitions, obituaries, ephemera, clippings, printed material, and other materials. Some organizational records are also included. The series documents a wide range of subjects relating to Bronxville School. Arranged alphabetically.

53-54 *Bronxville Board of Education Records, 1900-1914, 1921-1928, 1956-1962, 1980-1982, 2003.* About 1,600 pages. Correspondence, invoices, payment receipts, legal documents, insurance policies, notes, printed material, and other materials relating to the acquisition of books and supplies, the maintenance and repair of the school facilities, student attendance, teacher contracts and other personnel matters, New York State education department inspections, the creation of the

Bronxville school district, students from outside the Bronxville school district attending Bronxville School, and Bronxville students attending schools in other school districts, construction of the second Bronxville School building (1906, addition 1911), the sale of the original Bronxville School property (1924-1925), and the acquisition of the site for and the construction of the third, and present, Bronxville School (1922-1925). The series is in two halves: the first relating to school business in the period 1900 to 1914, and the second relating primarily to the planning for and construction of new school buildings in the period 1921-1926. The series is arranged into these two halves and also in an approximate chronological order.

55-66 *Faculty Files*, 1926-1980s. 4.4 linear feet (about 7,800 pages and 1,275 slides).

Consisting of five subseries:

- *Eleanor Burts Files*, c. 1950s and undated. About 250 pages. Elementary School teacher, kindergarten. The papers include Burts's writings about teaching, student writings, a dictionary for students, and printed materials. Arranged primarily by document type.
- *Erna Christensen Files*, 1940s-1980s, bulk 1950s-1970s. 1.5 linear feet (about 2,400 pages). Elementary School teacher, early grades. Contains student writings and drawings, college course papers and notes, correspondence, essays, printed materials, outlines, bibliographies and other materials relating to the teaching of reading and writing to young children, Christensen's postgraduate education and professional activities, communicating with parents, and other subjects. Arranged alphabetically by subject.
- *Doris Crossley Jackson Files*, c. 1940s-1980s. 2.4 linear feet (about 4,400 pages and 100 photographs). Elementary School teacher, grades 1 to 4. Student writings (stories, poems, letters, reports), correspondence, notes, photographs. Some, maybe most, of the student writings are candidates for inclusion in student publications. Includes some material relating to Alvina Tueut Burrows. The photographs, personal in character, are in two albums. Arranged alphabetically by subject.
- *Murray Linden Files*, 1940s-1960s. About 500 pages. High School teacher, music. Contains primarily programs for High School produced events. Arranged alphabetically by subject.
- *Edith Penney Scrapbooks*, 1926-1934. About 250 pages. High School principal; Associate Superintendent of Schools, Bronxville Union Free School District. Two scrapbooks relating to Bronxville School, with items from newspapers in Bronxville, New York City, Minneapolis, Cleveland and other cities.

67-71 *Bronxville Parent Teacher Association Records*, 1929-1932, 1944-1945, 1955-1959, 1964-1987, 1995, 1998, 2002-2003. 2 linear feet (about 3,200 pages).

Consisting of four subseries:

- *Bronxville Parent Teacher Association Council File*, 1929-1932, 1944-1945, 1971-1974, 1976-1977, 1979-1981, 1985-1986, 1995, 1998, 2002-2003. About 800 pages. Minutes of meetings (primarily the Bronxville PTA Council), correspondence, notes, reports, lists, budget documents, by-laws, forms, drafts of PTA show script material (1944-1945), newspaper clippings, and printed material (primarily auction catalogs, 1994-1995, 1998, 2002-2005) relating to the meetings and other activities of the PTA and its constituent committees. The folders containing material from 1931-1932 contain a wider variety of types of material than the later-dated folders. The series includes a folder relating to public program sponsored by the PTA in 1944. Arranged in approximately chronological order.
- *Academic Achievement Committee File*, 1955-1959, 1964-1985. About 600 pages. Correspondence, memorandums, reports, lists and printed material relating primarily to the PTA's student awards program. Arranged chronologically by graduation year.
- *Memorial Day Activities File*, 1968-1987. About 1,600 pages. Reports, correspondence, notes, memorandums, minutes of meetings, lists of committee members, invoices, diagrams, permit applications, evaluation forms, printed materials, posters, and pinned buttons relating to Parent Teacher Association activities at Bronxville School during Memorial Day weekend, including barbecues, games, races, auctions, sales, raffles, parades, dances, and performances. Arranged chronologically.

72-79 *Bronxville Elementary School Council Records*, 1951-1998. 2.8 linear feet (about 5,600 pages).

- Minutes, agendas, lists, questionnaires, reports, calendars of events, correspondence, memorandums, postings, and other materials relating to the work of the Bronxville Elementary School Council, a support organization composed of mothers of elementary school students. Includes minutes of the meetings of the council (set incomplete), reports of council chairs and committees (set incomplete), and copies of the council's newsletter, *It's Elementary* (1969-2005, set perhaps fairly complete). The minutes of meetings and related materials are

arranged chronologically by date of meeting; they are followed by the issues of *It's Elementary*, also arranged chronologically.

80-86 *Bronxville High School Council Records*, 1958-1987. 2 linear feet (about 4,000 pages).

- Minutes of meetings, committee reports from the Council's numerous committees, budget documents, membership lists, questionnaires, correspondence, lists of committee members, curriculum materials, printed materials and other materials relating to the work of the Bronxville High School Council, a support organization composed of mothers of high school students. Minutes are placed at the beginning of the series and are arranged chronologically; the remainder of the series is arranged in an approximate alphabetical order, usually by committee name.

87-91 *Alumni Files*, c.1948-c. 2015, bulk 1980-2005. 2 linear feet (about 4,000 pages).

- Correspondence, reunion memory books, biographical material and reminiscences, lists of alumni, clippings, printed materials, photographs, and other materials relating primarily to class reunions of the Bronxville High School graduating classes of 1938, 1939, 1940, 1941, 1942, 1943, 1945, 1946, 1948, 1949, 1950, 1951, 1953, 1958, 1960, 1963, and 1964. About a third of the material in the series relates to the Class of 1948. Arranged chronologically by graduating class.

92-136 *Photograph File*, 1895-2000s, bulk 1920s-2000s (about 13,400 photographs). Consisting of three subseries:

- *Subject File Subject File*, 1895-c. 1990s, bulk 1920s-1970s (about 2,000 photographs). Arranged alphabetically by subject.
- *Public Information Office Photograph File*, Bulk 1990s-2000s (about 1,800 photographs). Arranged for the most part alphabetically by subject.
- *High School Yearbook Photographs File*, 1982-1991, and *Undated* (about 7,300 photographs). Arranged chronologically.
