

# Q14 The population of the Village is about right, and the Village should generally neither encourage nor discourage additional housing development.





# Q15 Additional urbanization and crowding threaten the character of the Village in the long term.





# Q16 Do you support continued temporary closures of Park Place to create a pedestrian plaza for special events?





# Q17 Would you support a permanent closing of Park Place for a pedestrian plaza?







#### Q22 What types of stores/services would you like to see in the CBD?



### Q23 Roughly how often per month do you eat in a restaurant in Bronxville?





#### Q24 Where do you dine outside of Bronxville?





# Q35 Which best describes your feelings regarding the population in Bronxville and need for additional housing development? Please choose one answer that best reflects your views.





### Q42 Would you like to see additional recreational facilities in the Village? If so, what?







#### Q46 How often do you use the taxi station services?







### Q50 Do you think the existing assortment of parking meter times is sufficient?









### Q53 Would you support a parking structure at any of these locations on the east side of the CBD?







### Q55 Do you support increased services and growth of the NYP/Lawrence Hospital complex?





#### Q56 Do you utilize the hospital, and if so, what services?





#### Q57 How often do you use the library?





### Q58 Are you satisfied with the services of the library or are there additional services you would like to see offered?









#### Q62 Which of the following best describes where you live?







#### Q64 What best describes your residence in Bronxville?





#### Q65 Where do you work? Check all that apply.





### Q66 If you do not live or work in Bronxville, what is your interest in the Village? Check all that apply.





#### Q67 How many vehicles are in your household?





#### Q68 What is your gender?




