THE LATEST NEWS FROM VILLAGE HALL

Unlike other cycles in the business world, the month of April proves to be the busiest as we swear in new official, reconfigure boards and craft the annual budget due in Albany on May 1.

At the Board of Trustees' Meeting on April 8th, Trustee Knapp, Trustee Mary Taylor Behrens and Judge Natasha Nordahl will take the oath of office to continue to serve the Village.

They have been exceptional colleagues and I look forward to working together as we go forward as stewards of our very special Village.

Since spring is literally popping up all over the Village, I thought it only appropriate to highlight the ongoing efforts of our Green Committee.

- During the month of April, the Green Committee is offering home delivery of Food Scrap Kits. Residents can go [online](#) to purchase a kit and volunteers will deliver them to the resident's home.
- The Green Committee and staff from Village Hall have been working hard on the Climate Action efforts to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and implement actions to adapt to climate change. Because of these efforts, the Village of Bronxville has secured over \$77,000 in grant monies to use towards our climate adaptation efforts, and has once again received Bronze Certification with only 121 other communities in the entire state have received the same certification.
- Beginning early May, the Village will host compost give back events. The compost is the direct result of the community's participation in our food scrap recycling program. The scraps are sent to a facility upstate for processing which results in the wonderful compost that can be used in gardens, flowerbeds and around trees.
- On June 1, the Village will host Take Back Day which will provide residents an opportunity to recycle old clothing, electronics and shred sensitive documents.

The Village of Bronxville has partnered with Helpsy to offer a free home pickup clothing recycling service for the local community. This new service makes it as easy as possible for residents to responsibly dispose of their unwanted clothing. The service will not only help our DPW by lightening their pickup loads, but also help keep clothing out of the trash. For more information [click here](#).



NEWS FROM THE TRUSTEES

The Village Board’s March 11th meeting included two public hearings:

Tax Cap Override Local Law: This annual local law is considered in conjunction with the annual budget since any increase in the tax levy beyond the State allowable increase for that year must be first approved before adoption of the budget. Sanitary Sewer Laterals-Inspections, Repairs, Replacement and Ongoing Maintenance Local Law: Proposed local law will identify minimum standards on how a sanitary sewer lateral should be maintained, define requirements for the correction of defective conditions and also establish criteria for when inspections of sanitary sewer laterals will be required. The purpose of the local law is to reduce infiltration and inflow of clean waters into the public sanitary sewer system and to reduce sewage exfiltration into the natural waterways of the Village. The full local law can be viewed [here](#): The public hearing was adjourned to the Board’s May 13th meeting. Any comments regarding the proposed law should be forward to the Village Administrator at jpalmer@vobny.com.

The Board also approved a resolution documenting the use of all Federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) monies totaling \$657, 228 dollars. A full list of the capital items funded through ARPA can be found [here](#).

The Board also authorized the use of unassigned fund balance to close out several capital projects including a police vehicle, police security cameras and improvements at the DPW garage.

The Village Board’s April 8th meeting will include a public hearing on the 2024-25 Village Budget at 7pm. A copy of the proposed budget can be found [here](#):

Highlights of the proposed budget include:


- A tax rate of \$3.648 per thousand dollars of assessed value – a 1.68% increase over last year (or a tax increase of \$156 for the median home value of \$2,600,000).
- General Fund appropriations of \$20,363,995, an increase of \$777,255 or 3.96% from the 2022-23 adopted budget – a breakdown of appropriations can be [found here](#).
- A General Fund contribution to the Library Fund of \$1,645,909, an increase of \$87,321 or 5.6% above last year.
- Non-real property tax revenues of \$6,752,203, a decrease of \$79,537 from last year.
- The Village’s taxable value increased to \$3,466,444,130, an increase of \$165,000,000 from last year.

The April 8th meeting will also include the annual appointments and actions associated with the start of the new Village Year – beginning with oaths of office for re-elected Trustees Helen Knapp and Mary Taylor Behrens and Village Justice Natasha Nordahl.

Other items to be considered at the April 8th meeting include ratification of a new four-year contract with the Bronxville Police Taylor Act Committee (PBA). A resolution authorizing the Planning Board to review seasonal on-street dining site plan applications will also be considered in addition to the purchase of a new dump truck for the Department of Public Works. DEPT. OF PUBLIC WORKS

Veolia Water will be starting our annual flushing of fire hydrants starting the week of April 1st.

Stormwater Update:

Paxton Avenue and Parkway Road – NYS Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) should have a draft report of short and long-term mitigation opportunities to reduce flooding in this area by the summer.

Crawford Drainage Improvements: The Village continues to work with the Town of Eastchester to finalize drainage improvements on Village and Town property located within the Town and we anticipate starting construction later this summer. The Village portion of the project will consist of a series of open channels and stormwater detention areas in the open park areas.

Hamilton/Sussex/Homesdale Drainage Improvements: Following an allegation of an illicit discharge from our stormwater system into neighboring Mt. Vernon the Village sampled multiple stormwater manholes along Homesdale, Homesdale at Sturgis and along Sunnybrae and no fecal coliform was detected.

The Village has retained an additional engineer to complete an hydraulic analysis on the improvements. The Village DPW recently installed a vented manhole cover on Sussex to assist with the release of trapped air in the conveyance pipe.


FROM CHIEF SATRIALE'S DESK


