THE LATEST NEWS FROM VILLAGE HALL

Following multiple work sessions and a public hearing on the Village budget the Village Board adopted the 2023-24 budget on April 24th. The budget of \$19,586,740 will result in a tax levy of 11,850,000 and equate to a tax bill increase of \$210.00 (to \$8,972.50) for a median home value of \$2.5 million.

After the budget process was completed, we focused on several environmental initiatives with the spring weather galvanizing us, so April turned out to be indeed a green month.

Thanks to the efforts of the Green Committee, we had a Bronxville Clean and Green Day on April 15 with scouts, middle school students, green committee members and many of us from Village Hall cleaned up our Village downtown and parks.

We also had a compost give back on Earth Day, April 22nd. We still have some very rich soil adjacent to our food scrap recycling bins, so feel free to take as needed.

On the food scrap front, approximately 200 households are participating in the programs and just based on this modest inaugural effort, we have diverted 40 tons of food scraps from the regular waste stream.

On Arbor Day, April 28th, we planted a Majestic Linden Tree at the intersection of Kensington Road and Beechtree Lane. Going forward, a new signature Beech Tree will grace the location when we can source a disease resistant one.

Our Giving Garden is literally sprouting and already school groups have enjoyed tours.

The Farmers Market will open May 13th and will be in the Maltby parking lot every Saturday going forward from 8:30 AM to 1 PM.

Our 101st Memorial Day parade will kick off at 8:30AM on Parkway Rd., May 29th with Village employee Richard King, a decorated army veteran, as our Grand Marshall.

Finally looking forward, we will kick off June with the annual Sidewalk Sale where good buys are had by all. Happy Spring!!

FARMERS MARKET Saturday, May 13th from 8:30am to 1:00pm



NEWS FROM THE TRUSTEES

On Tuesday, March 21, 2023 Mayor Marvin was re-elected to serve a new twoyear term along with both Robert Underhill and William Fredericks, both of whom were re-elected as Trustees to serve two-year terms.

The Annual Meeting of the Village Board was held on Monday, April 10, 2023. The Mayor re-appointed Robert Underhill to serve as Deputy Mayor. Additional appointments made pursuant to Village Law can be found <u>here</u>. The Annual Meeting also included such annual actions as the designation of the Village's official newspaper for legal publications, authorization of the banking institutions the Village will maintain deposits with, procurement policy and the designation of where official Village meetings take place.

The Village Board also held its public hearing on the 2023-24 Village Budget. The Board kept the public hearing open to written comment until Friday, April 21, 2023 and convened on Monday, April 24, 2023 to adopt the budget. The adopted budget included an additional \$100,000 in appropriations for Police Department overtime bringing total appropriations to \$19,586,740. The additional overtime expenditures are being allocated for downtown walking patrols and traffic enforcement during the summer months.

Non real property tax revenues were increased by \$50,000 to \$6,831,740 by increasing downtown dining permitting fees. The use of tax stabilization monies were increased by \$50,000 to \$175,000. The levy of \$11,850,000 and tax rate increase of 2.39% remained unchanged from the proposed budget. Additional items approved at the April Annual Meeting included authorizing the Village's Consulting Engineer for stormwater and sanitary sewer work to commence a design for improvements to the Midland Valley Drainage Basin outfall channel at Scout Field to further increase the capacity of the existing stormwater conveyance system. Designs will be shared with Westchester County since the improvements are located on Bronx River Reservation land owned by Westchester County. The Village Board also recognized Friday, April 28th as Arbor Day in the Village and commemorated the day and our recognition as a Tree City USA with a tree planting in Bacon Woods Park!

PARKING

Electric Vehicle permits are available to be purchased for residents, business owners, and their employees. The permit allows charging from 8 am to 3 pm, Monday to Friday at the charging stations in the Parkway Road Lot and the Kensington Garage. The charging stations are open to the public after 3 pm on weekdays and all day Saturday and Sunday. The permit is valid from 5/1/23 to 4/30/23 and costs \$375.

FROM CHIEF SATRIALE'S DESK

Spring Training - January to March was an exceptionally busy period for the Police Department training program and highlights include:

- PoliceOne Academy Online Training officers completed training on arrest, search and seizure (Fourth Amendment)
- Defensive Tactics topics covered included controlling resisting suspects from a standing and grounded position and various handcuffing techniques
- Mobile Crisis Response Team Training utilizing the expertise and resources of the Westchester County Mobile Crisis Response Team
 officers learned about additional assistance for de-escalation and conflict resolution, coordination with medical and behavioral
 health services among other services
- Firearms Training
- Non-Lethal Training PepperBall
- Use of Force Refresher Course Training hosted by the New York State Department of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS)

25 MPH: IT'S NOW LAW

On February 13, 2023 the Village Board adopted legislation reducing the maximum speed limit on all Village streets to 25mph.

The reduced speed limit goes into effect on Sept 1st.

Residents are encouraged to be mindful of their speed as they travel throughout the Village. While a minor speed reduction, pedestrian safety and local quality of life are greatly enhanced.

Pedestrians are also reminded that when walking or running on local streets, always face oncoming traffic. Bicyclists, on the other hand, should ride in the same direction as traffic.
