THE LATEST NEWS FROM VILLAGE HALL

Following multiple work sessions and a public hearing on the Village budget, the Village Board adopted the 2024-25 budget on April 8th. The budget of \$20,363,995 will result in a tax levy which translates into a \$61 increase on every assessed value of \$1 million.

The budget was driven by increases in state pension obligations, insurance premiums for workers' compensation and general liability, interest on capital projects related to flood mitigation projects and an incremental downturn in our portion of the county tax revenue.

Given these variables that were out of our control, after much due diligence, we budgeted carefully and conservatively and welcome your comments.

After finishing what is the most important process in the Village, we turned to more joyous events as spring brings so much life to the Village. We are working hand-in-hand with Bronxville School to improve/replace our street trees in the public right away near the school, so they harmonize with the new school landscaping plan.

Just recently, Governor Hochul announced that we were one of the very few Westchester communities to receive bronze status, in terms of recertifying as a NYS Bronze Climate Smart Community. Much of it thanks to our green committee. We continue to strive for the silver medal!

The Village is popping with spring thanks to our incredibly supportive garden groups; the Bronxville Beautification Council, the Boulder Ledge Garden Club and the Working Gardeners all doing their incredible volunteer part throughout the Village.

Just recently, our incredible BBC volunteers filled planters throughout the Village and we thank them and they are working as I write.

The Giving Garden is also up and running thanks to the dedication of Farmer Dave and his team and students have already come to learn the importance of organic gardening.

This is also the season of benefits to not only honor some incredible Village residents but as an avenue to keep so many of our revered institutions serving their missions thanks to your volunteer dollars.

The Library held a "Back to the 60s" benefit which was a huge success as the support for our library is truly unprecedented and venerable Village citizens such as John Priesing are being honored by the Rotary Club, volunteer extraordinaire Mary Mackintosh by the Counseling Center and John and Marilynn Hill by Gramatan Village, just reinforcing the fact this Village could not be the home we have without the volunteer commitment of people like those being so deservedly honored this month.

Our Farmers Market, the second oldest in the county, will be in full swing at its home near the paddle courts every Saturday starting May 11th going forward beginning during the hours of 8:30AM to 1PM and it only gets better every year. Our Memorial Day Parade will kick off at 8:30AM on Parkway Road on May 27th with long standing resident and honored war Veteran, John Priesing as our Grand Marshal

Finally looking forward, the annual June sidewalk sale will take place on May 31st.

### **NEWS FROM THE TRUSTEES**

The Village Board's April 8th meeting included the public hearing on the 2024-25 budget which began with the Board and Administrator highlighting the principal non-real property tax revenues and expense changes from the prior year. A copy of proposed budget, the Administrator's narrative on the budget and a history on past adopted budgets can be <u>found here</u>. The Board adopted the budget on Thursday, April 25th.

The Village's annual meeting was also held on April 8th and commemorates the start of the new calendar year for elected and appointed office holders. Congratulations again to Trustees Mary Taylor Behrens and Helen Knapp who begin new two-year terms as Trustees and Justice Natasha Nordahl who begins a new four-year term as Village Justice. Other Items Considered and Approved by the Village Board on April 8th Included:

- A resolution to amend the Village's procurement policy: The policy mirrors the requirements and guidance set forth in the New York State General Municipal Law (GML) and dictates how the Village purchases goods and services, prevents unauthorized purchases and enforces internal controls. The policy was amended to also specify controls for the use of credit cards and online transactions. The Village's full procurement policy can be found on the <a href="Treasurer's page">Treasurer's page</a> on the Village website.
- A resolution to upgrade the Village's traffic signal at Midland and Tanglewylde: The Board authorized \$23,000 in expenditures to install new pedestrian signals and LED signals at this intersection to replace older equipment.
- A resolution ratifying a new four-year contract with the PBA: The new four-year contract covers all
  officers of the Police Department and includes increases in both wages and health insurance
  contributions from the Village in exchange for some other items including one less personal day for new
  hires.
- A resolution authorizing the purchase of a new dump truck and spreader for the Department of Public Works: The purchase allows for the replacement of a larger dump truck that was sold last year at public auction.
- A resolution authorizing the Planning Board to approve and/or disapprove on-street dining applications: The resolution allows for the Planning Board to review on-street dining applications and is consistent with their existing review of sidewalk dining applications as defined in the Village's zoning code. Additional information concerning the Village's extensive policy review of an on-street dining program and community outreach efforts including a Village-wide survey to gauge community interest in continuing such a program can be found by going to the <a href="Trustees page">Trustees page</a> on the Village website.

The Village Board's May 13th Meeting will Include the Following Resolutions:

- A resolution to fund \$64,100 in new tree plantings and installation along Pondfield Road and Midland Avenue. The project is part of the Bronxville School's new campus landscaping program which includes a new irrigation system, hedge and fence along the perimeter of the School as well as new wider sidewalks along Pondfield Road and Midland Avenue.
- A resolution to approve funding for a new Village website: The new website will allow for an upgrade of the Village's existing Civic Plus web open platform to a web central platform enabling more in-house capabilities for website development, programming and communication.
- The new site is expected to go live at the start of 2025.
- A resolution to increase parking fines for certain parking violations. The fine increases will include violations for illegal parking at handicapped designated spaces, double parking and unauthorized parking at loading/unloading zones.
- A resolution to establish energy benchmarking requirements for municipal buildings. The program will define the collection and reporting of building energy data for the purposes of assisting the Village with evaluating operational needs and capital investment decisions.

The Board will also continue the public hearing for the proposed law for sanitary sewer laterals – inspections, repairs, replacement and on-going maintenance. The proposed local law can be found <a href="https://example.com/here/beartage/">here:</a>
