NEWS FROM THE TRUSTEES

JUNE 14, 2021

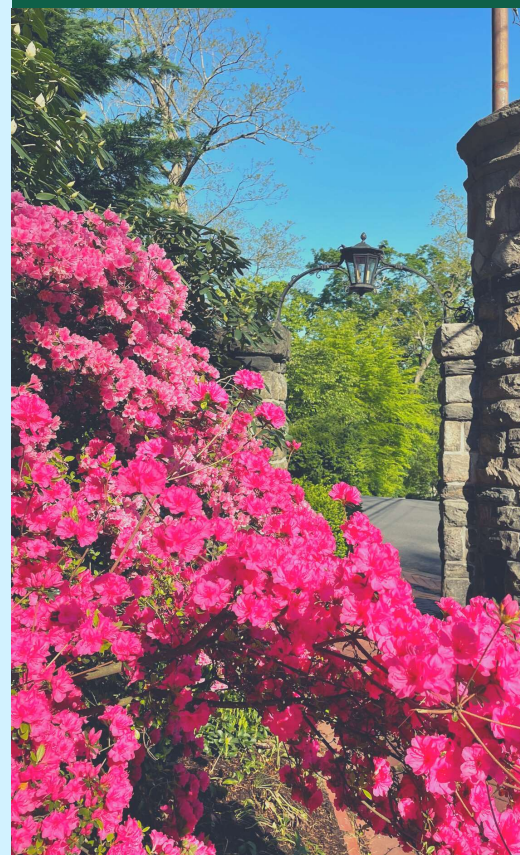
The Village Board will be holding its June meeting in person this month on June 14th in the Trustees Room at Village Hall. The Board will convene its work session at 6:30pm and the regular meeting will start at 7pm. The public are welcome to attend but are asked to wear face coverings. As always, the meeting will be aired on our public television channels.

Items on the Board's June agenda include:

- Holding a public hearing on the prohibition of smoking in certain public spaces. A copy of the draft local law being considered by the VB can be found [HERE](#).
- Considering a resolution to join the Westchester County Urban County Consortium for the purposes of participating in the County's Community Development Program as authorized under the Federal Housing and Community Development Act of 1974. The Village's participation in the County Consortium made up of other villages, towns and cities will afford the Village the opportunity to apply for federal funding for certain eligible projects. Projects currently being considered by the Village include pedestrian and traffic improvements at the intersection of Midland Avenue and Pondfield Road and also playground improvements at Sagamore Park.
- Ellen Edwards, Chair of the Green Committee will also be making a presentation to the Village Board on the Committee's review and recommendations concerning the expansion of the Village's existing prohibition of the use of gas powered leaf blowers.

TAX BILLS

The 2021-22 Village/School tax bills have been mailed. First half taxes are due without penalty by Wednesday, June 30th.

DPW FACILITY CONSTRUCTION

Work on the new 9,000 s.f. building continues on schedule and is anticipated to be ready for occupancy by July. In addition to storing the Village Public Works fleet the building will also house offices and a break room for staff. Replacement of the roof on the existing DPW building is also underway.

PARKING PERMITS

Merchants are reminded that their current permits will expire on June 30th and renewals will be mailed shortly. GAS POWERED LEAF BLOWERS

COVID UPDATE

Public access inside Village Hall has been expanded to include the second floor office areas occupied by the Assessor and Building Department. The Justice Court has also resumed scheduled in-person hearings. However, the Village is still requiring that patrons wear face coverings when entering the building.

FROM CHIEF SATTRIALE'S DESK

The Police Department has continued to implement the recommendations of the Police Community Relations Committee (PCRC). Most recently, all of the police officers completed a series of multi-day de-escalation training exercises including training on the use of less lethal options such as OC Spray (also referred to as Pepper Spray) and Pepper Ball and these options have now been added to the force continuum.

WHAT'S THIS?

You may have spotted some interesting new additions to our sidewalks recently...These new style water hydrants are being installed by the Village's water utility provider – Suez. They are called Sigelock (sig-a-lock) Spartan fire hydrants, and are being installed systematically as the older units are taken out of service. All exterior parts are encapsulated which insures better weather resistance and tamper proof and the improved design is better for draining which prevents frozen barrels in the winter.
