Training Highlights

Training for the second quarter was focused outside the department. Officers completed Emergency Medical Technician courses and supervisors focused on leadership and administration training. As a department, we held the second of our 4 department firearms qualifications in June. Towards the end of second quarter we began a joint Active Shooter Training with the surrounding jurisdictions of Eastchester PD and Tuckahoe PD. The remaining 3 training sessions will be completed in the next quarter.

Departmental Training

Department Firearms Training: Department Firearms Qulification was held in June at the Blue Mountain Police Range. Officers qualified with their department issued Glock 22 handguns and patrol rifles.

Specialized Training

New York DCJS Basic Course for Police Officers: In May, PO Iglesias completed his New York State DCJS certified Basic Course for Police Officers. PO Iglesias is now a sworn police officer. *DCJS Radar Operator Course:* In May, PO Iglesias attended a DCJS Radar Operator Course at the Westchester County Police Academy. The course certified PO Iglesias as a Radar Operator.

Emergency Response Unit: PO Sokol, PO Stein, PO Cooper and Sgt DeYoung completed an average of 8 hours of Emergency Response Unit training. Topics included Less Lethal Weapons Certification, Active Shooter Response and structure clearing strategies.

Law Enforcement Training Directors Association of the State of New York Conference: In April, PO Lewis, Sgt DeYoung and Chief Satriale attended the annual LETDANYS Training Director Conference in Lake George, NY. The conference focused on sharing new training techniques and best practices amongst training directors and training staff throughout New York State. Topics covered included Redesigning Firearms Training, The Four Pillars of Leadership, Contemporary Legal Issues for Police Trainers and Methods of Instruction.

FBI LEEDA Command Leadership Institute: In April, SGT Van der Leeuw and SGT Carrol attended the FBI LEEDA's Command Leadership Institute. The Command Leadership Institute is an intensive 5 day training desinged to prepare officers for command level positions. Topics covered included command discipline and liability, credibility, dealing with problem employees and leading change within an organization.

FBI Law Enforcement Executive Development Seminar: In June, SGT Van der Leeuw attended the Mid-Atlantic Law Enforcement Executive Development Seminar hosted by FBI LEEDA at Princeton University. The MALEEDS Seminar is designed to provide leadership training for police chiefs and higher-ranking law enforcment executives who are in leadership positions in departments. This highly successful and selective program provides insight into some of the many challenges facing today's police executives. This highly selective seminar only accepts approximately 50% of the police executive applicants that apply yearly from New Jersey, New York and Pennsylvania. The curriculum covered Leadership, Domestic Terrorism, Crisis Communication, Officer Wellness and Emotional Sirvival for Law Enforcement.

New Jersey State Police Homicide Investigators Conference: In June, SGT Carroll attended the NJ Police Homicide Investigators Conference in Princeton, NJ. Topics

covered included Interview and Interogation, Behavioral Analysis, Crime Scene Reconstruction, Advancements in Digital Evidence, Forensic Pathology, as well as major cases studies.

New York State Emergency Medical Technician School: In June, PO Cooper and PO Dibenedetto completed their 4 month New York State Emergency Medical Technician course, hosted by the New Rochelle Fire Department. Upon successful completion of the New York State exam bith officers will be certified EMT's.

Training Hours by Officer

Officers completed an average of 47 hours of training for the months April through June 2023.
