Training Highlights

Internal training for the fourth quarter of 2022 focused on Department Firearms qualifications and Traffic Safety. Officers attended a number of specialized training courses throughout the quarter. We were able to add a Defensive Tactics Instructor, as well as an additional member of our Department Emergency Response Unit. Included in this training report is the total training hours for officers for 2022. The training staff and officers worked hard this year and we were able to train an additional 1,000 hours compared to 2021.

PoliceOne Academy Online Training

Officers completed 1 hour of PoliceOne Academy training for the quarter. Topics covered included Traffic Stops and Officer Safety. Supervisors completed an additional hour of training in Leadership 1.

Departmental Training

Department Firearms Qualification: In November, we held our fourth Firearms Qualification of the year at Blue Mountain Police Range. All officers qualified with their department issued Glock handguns.

Specialized Training

MPTC Defensive Tactics Instructor Course: In November, PO Danso-Faried attended the Municipal Police Training Council's Defensive Tactics Instructor Course. This 10 day course certified PO Danso-Faried as an instructor in defensive tactics for police officers. Topics covered included Principals of Defensive Control Tactics, 1 and 2 Officer Ground Control Techniques, 1 and 2 Officer Takedowns, Striking Techniques, Weapon Retention Techniques, Weapons Defense Techniques and Handcuffing Techniques.

New York State DCJS SWAT School: In October, PO Sokol and PO Stein attended the DCJS New York State SWAT Operator course hosted by Westchester County PD. The course certified PO Stein and PO Sokol as SWAT Operators and allowed them to become members of the joint Emergency Response Unit of Bronxville PD, Tuckahoe PD and Eastchester PD. The course covered topics including firearms proficiency, tactical movements, use of ballistic shields, land navigation, active shooter response, covert and overt room and structure clearing concepts, intelligence gathering, operational planning, high risk warrant service, tactical medical training, breaching tactics, less lethal weapons certification, defensive tactics and other tactics utilized by SWAT operators.

Stop The Bleed Instructor Course: In November, PO Danso-Faried, PO Sokol and PO Cooper attended a Stop the Bleed Instructor course hosted by Bronxville PD and taught by Westchester Medical Center. Officers were taught methods of hemorrhage control and methods of utilizing tourniquets. Officers were certified to instruct Stop the Bleed courses.

New York State Association of Chiefs of Police Leadership Training Summit: In November, Chief Satriale, LT Bunyan and SGT DeYoung attended the NY State Association of Chiefs of Police Leadership Training Summit in Glens Falls, NY. Topics covered included gun violence initiatives, gun intelligence, legal updates and leadership.

Domestic Violence Police Conference: In October, SGT Sandarciero, SGT Van Der Leeuw and PO Dibenedetto attended an Interactive Police Conference on Domestic Violence hosted by the Westchester County Office for

Women. Topics covered included Trauma Informed Response to Victims, Domestic Violence High Risk Team, Westchester Case Studies of Domestic Violence and a review of new laws and trends in Domestic Violence.

Active Threat Integrated Response Course: In November, SGT DeYoung and PO Lewis attended an Active Threat Integrated Response course at the State Domestic Preparedness Training Center in Oriskany, NY. The 24 hour course is designed to improve integration between law enforcement, fire, and emergency medical services in active shooter events. The course provided law enforcement officers with medical skills based on tactical emergency casualty care guidelines and also provided a model framework for law enforcement, fire, and EMS to integrate responses during an active shooter event through the rescue task force concept. Topics covered included Incident Command, Integrated Active Shooter Incident Management Checklist, Staging Procedures and Resource Management, Direct and Indirect Threat Care, Tactical Response Considerations and Rescue Task Force Integration and EMS Advanced Skills.

ALERT Civilian Response to Active Shooter Events Train-the-Trainer: In December, PO Cooper completed an online training given by Advanced Law Enforcement Rapid Response Training (ALERT) to become an instructor for their Civilian Response to Active Shooter Events (CRASE) course. The CRASE course was designed and built on the Avoid, Deny, Defend strategy for civilian response to active violence events. The course provides strategies, guidance and a proven plan for surviving an active shooter event. Topics covered included the history and prevalence of active shooter events, civilian response options, medical issues, and considerations for conducting drills. PO Cooper now joins SGT DeYoung as our CRASE Instructors and will begin offering CRASE courses to the public in 2023.

Breath Analysis Operator: In December, PO Dentini, PO Butler and PO Dibenedetto attended Breath Analysis Operator course at Westchester County Police Academy. This 24 hour course taught officers the concepts and principals of breath alcohol testing and certified them as BAO testers.

Car Seat Installation Technician: In December, PO Dentini attended training to become a nationally certified Child Passenger Safety Technician. PO

Dentini will now offer car seat installation services to the community. PO Dentini will also offer car seat inspections and give presentations to the community regarding traffic safety and the importance of proper use of child restraint systems and seat belts.

New York Law Enforcement Officers and the Law – Practices and Procedures: In November, LT Bunyan and SGT DeYoung attended a training on practices and procedures of law enforcement in the state of New York.. The training covered current constitutional requirements and contemporary issues facing law enforcement. Areas of focus included an overview of case law pertaining to street encounters and warrantless searches, Duty to Intercede and its relevance in day-to-day operations, and trends in court decisions pertaining to use of force, qualified immunity and dealing with persons in crisis.

Emergency Response Unit: Sgt. DeYoung, PO Cooper, PO Stein and PO Sokol attended approximately 80 hours of training to fulfill their Emergency Response Unit training requirement. Training consisted of Firearms Qualification, Tubular Assaults, Warrant Service and Tactical Combat Casualty Care.

Officers completed an average of 40 hours of training for the months October through December 2022.
