HOW TO SAFELY DISPOSE OF WASTE

GENERAL INFORMATION

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED

PICKUP DAYS

RECYCLING

Recycling bins may be purchased from the Village Department of Public Works Office for \$10.00 each. A request for a recycling bin can also be made at our website www.villageofbronxville.com by selecting the Department of Public Works link. All materials must be placed curbside by 7:00 AM on the collection date. Do not place items in plastic bags.

COMMINGLED ITEMS:

GLASS: only food and beverage containers made of unbroken **clear brown or green** glass. **METAL CONTAINERS:** food and beverage containers, clean aluminum foil and trays, and **empty** aerosol cans.

PLASTICS: PET and HDPE plastic containers (codes 1 thru 7 printed on container) commonly used for food, beverages, detergents or shampoos.

All commingled items should be rinsed, lids removed, and combined in one or more bins. **Metal and plastic lids and caps can be placed with your commingled items.** Labels need not be removed.

PAPER ITEMS:

NEWSPAPERS, OUTDATED PHONE BOOKS, MAGAZINES, JUNK MAIL, BROCHURES, CATALOGS, ADVERTISEMENTS, LETTERS & ENVELOPES: Place at curbside in the "Blue Box", brown paper bags, or corrugated cardboard boxes. Do not bundle them with cord, twine or rope, or put them in plastic bags. **CORRUGATED CARDBOARD & BROWN PAPER BAGS:** Remove excessive amounts of adhesive tape, tie in bundles or break down and box. Do not place in plastics bags. Keep items dry,

Medical waste, syringes, IV bottles, IV tubes, etc.

Light bulbs, kitchenware, crystal, mirrors & windows, paint cans, pesticide containers, oil cans, five gallon pails, foam plastic, plastic bags and flower pots.

Any container containing potentially hazardous chemicals.

Hardcover books, orange juice containers.
No styrofoam or plastic packing materials.

HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE

Regular household garbage will be collected twice weekly on designated days. **Please note that on holidays, garbage collection will be canceled for that day which will result in only one pickup that week. See Schedule on reverse.**

Recyclables, household hazardous wastes, large items qualifying for bulky pickup

BULKY WASTE

FEE: \$20.00

Your bulky waste pick-up can be scheduled and paid for by going to our website www.villageofbronxville.com and selecting the Department of Public Works link. All pick-ups shall be scheduled no later than 11:00AM of the day preceding the pick-up. Please note that payment must be received before the scheduled pick-up date. Items for collection must be placed curbside the night before or by 7:00AM the morning of the scheduled pick-up.

Items of collection: old furniture, old carpeting and padding, old books, dried open paint cans. Basically anything too heavy for regular garbage that does not qualify as a household hazardous waste.

Car batteries, car tires, building materials, debris from construction work, bath tubs, water heaters, heating boilers, iron, steel, stones propane tanks.

Refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners (properly stickered with freon and doors removed). Computer monitors and television monitors, washers, dryers, and electronic equipment.

CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS: Please note that the Village is prohibited from picking up construction debris at any time.

BATTERIES: Spent household batteries such as those found in flashlights, radios and toys **may be placed in your regular garbage.** Retailers that sell rechargeable batteries are required to accept up to ten used rechargeable batteries from consumers per day, for free with no purchase necessary

Car batteries: return to place of purchase

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

Household Hazardous Waste is collected by Westchester County at their Household Material Recovery Facility located in Valhalla, N.Y. This facility is open to all Bronxville residents by appointment only. Please visit the website at www.westchestergov.com/hmrf or call 914-813-5425 to schedule an appointment. Do not throw any hazardous household chemicals into your garbage or down the drain.

Items must be brought to the HMRF. Contact Westchester County at 813-5425 or visit them at www.westchestergov.com/hmrf to schedule an appointment.

YARD WASTE material as outlined below shall be placed in BIODEGRADABLE BAGS

1. Please do not put concrete, soil or other non-organic material in the bag and do not overfill them.
2. Branches should be cut into 4 foot lengths and tied into bundles not exceeding 18" in diameter.
3. Keep all yard waste behind the curb and not in the street.
4. We encourage our residents to leave their grass clippings on their lawn as a means of recycling. Grass clippings can also be placed with your yard waste in biodegradable bags.

Tree trunks, stumps, large limbs over 4" in diameter, dirt, sod, and stones

AUTUMN LEAVES

Do not mix twigs, branches, rubbish, flowers or any other materials in the leaf piles as it delays collection. Place behind the curb and keep off the streets and sidewalks; do not block fire hydrants or storm drains. **IMPORTANT: The use of gasoline-powered blowers is unlawful in the Village from December 15th – March 15th AND May 15th – October 15th. Your landscapers must have a Village license to operate within Bronxville.**
